The thematic seasons of the past 12 years have provided an opportunity to systematically discover the opera oeuvre, and to a lesser extent, the treasures of the ballet genre, and thus, to develop the institution's incomparably rich repertoire further. If we take the national segments, French, German and Italian culture also received very serious emphasis in their respective seasons, and naturally, the Hungarian season was even more important. There is a large and very different opera and ballet culture on the universal palette that has not yet been given the chance to shine as it would deserve, and this is the culture of the Slavic peoples and nations.

Our carefully constructed season features Czech, Lithuanian, Polish, Russian, and Slovak as well as South Slavic works, performers and subject matters. Who would have thought, but a total of more than 40 opera and ballet titles, and orchestral pieces include Slavic involvement! The large family of Slavic peoples that surrounds Hungary includes at least 13 nations, and it is vital to understand and feel each other's existence through art. The Slavic Season of the OPERA includes 14 premieres, 41 opera titles and 19 ballet choreographies, a total of 365 performances in 12 months at 3 venues. And they – as well as the audience – are really fortunate, because in 2023/24 we will offer them one of the widest selections in Budapest, Hungary, and the world.

OPERA PREMIERES

The Slavic Season provides an opportunity to present several works that Hungarian audiences have rarely or never heard. 110 years after its Pest premiere, *Boris Godunov* will be performed for the first time in Mussorgsky's original arrangement, and *Rusalka*, Dvořák's worldfamous opera, which could only be seen by the public in Budapest as guest performances decades ago, will also be added to the repertoire. Other outstanding events of the season include Péter Eötvös's first Hungarian-language opera composed especially for the Hungarian State Opera, the doyen of Hungarian theatre life, Miklós Szinetár will re-stage *Fra Diavolo*, his first production from 70 years ago, and with *Don Giovanni*, the OPERA will license a production from Salzburg, directed by Claus Guth.

BALLET PREMIERES

Every year without fail, the Hungarian National Ballet, increasingly praised by international critics, proves that its capabilities know no bounds: it manages to entrance audiences with everything from grand ballets requiring spectacular classical technique to contemporary dance pieces interspersed with acrobatic elements. In the 2023/24 season, the series of ballet performances for children will be expanded with a new production: this time the young audience can go on an adventurous journey with *Little Corsaire*, and Bartók's *Dance Triptych* will be reimagined with choreographies by Kristóf Várnagy and Marianna Venekei.

REPERTOIRE

OPERA HOUSE

Equipped with state-of-the-art technology, the Opera House, which has regained its former glory, welcomes lovers of opera and ballet, as well as visitors who are just getting to know the genre, with a wide repertoire of Hungarian and international pieces in the 2023/24 season. The audience will be able to see productions seen only at the Erkel Theatre previously, for the first time in the history of OPERA, Wagner's *Ring* cycle will be staged on four consecutive days, in addition to the longest *Nutcracker* series to date, fans of dance can enjoy the most spectacular classical and neoclassical choreographies, but those who are interested in symphonic concerts can also choose from a colourful palette. Moreover, the Ybl Palace offers programmes all year round, so viewers "escaping" from the heat can enjoy Verdi's popular operas during the summer months.




REPERTOIRE

Apart from Hungarian State Opera productions, various guest performances will also take place: lovers of lighter genres like musicals and pop concerts will find a number of programmes including a unique traditional Korean performance combining song, music and dance.

Tours and GUEST PERFORMANCES



The Slavic Season is not without opportunities when the ensembles and artists of the Hungarian State Opera can appear at alternative stages and international venues. The audiences can enjoy outdoor opera performances at well-established summer venues. In 2023, the MARGARET ISLAND OPEN-AIR THEATRE presents Attila by Verdi as well as a gala performance of Pretty Yende

and Nadine Sierra accompanied by the OPERA Orchestra, and a new production of *Il barbiere di Siviglia* will be presented here next year.

Visitors to the **VALLEY OF ARTS** will not be left without an operatic experience, either, and during the unmissable annual OperaFüred programmes, the OPERA Chorus and Orchestra await the audience of **BALATONFÜRED** again, while participants of the Anna Ball can also enjoy performances by our ballet dancers.

There is nothing more suitable to indicate the high standard of the OPERA's ensembles and its productions like the many

international invitations they receive every year. In June 2023, Pelléas et Mélisande is presented in Bucharest, and for the very first time, the Hungarian State Opera and the Hungarian National Ballet will make guest appearances in Dubai with Madama Butterfly and Swan Lake. The latter is to be presented in Istanbul by the ballet company in the foreseeable future, too.

STARS OF THE SEASON

Opera-goers may already be used to the biggest names in the international opera world occasionally appearing alongside our world-class Hungarian singers in Budapest. Some have even become recurring guests, enthralling audiences at gala events as well as in opera roles.

PLÁCIDO DOMINGO, who is certainly the international star on stage for the longest time in the world of opera, has appeared in Hungary many times, most recently in 2022 at the *Reopening Gala* of the Opera House and in performances of *Simon Boccanegra*. In December 2023, he will visit Budapest again in the title role of the concert version of *Nabucco*. *Il trovatore* can also be seen in a concert version in the Locomotive Hall of the Eiffel Art Studios in February 2024, where the roles of Leonora and Manrico will be sung by the returning star singer-couple Anna Netrebko and Yusif Eyvazov.

The OPERA continues its Star recitals with piano accompaniment series in which international renowned artists including KRISTĪNE OPOLAIS, PIOTR BECZAŁA, OLGA PERETYATKO and FERRUCCIO FURLANETTO all well-known to Hungarian audiences will appear on stage of the Opera House. The series will also give the opportunity for the American LISETTE OROPESA to make her Budapest debut.

Independent gala evenings for active Hungarian Kossuth Award recipient opera singers will also take place entitled *Prima Donnas*. The seven internationally renowned artists - ILONA TOKODY, ILDIKÓ KOMLÓSI, LUKÁCS GYÖNGYI, KLÁRA KOLONITS, ESZTER SÜMEGI, ERIKA MIKLÓSA and ANDREA ROST - can choose their programme freely in the intimate Bánffy Stage of the Eiffel Art Studios.

DIRECTORS AND CHOREOGRAPHERS OF THE SEASON

A great number of directors and choreographers will again be responsible for maintaining the variety of the works on the institution's repertoire: they include foreign artists as well as recognised artists and up-and-coming talents.

Two significant operas, Rusalka and Boris Godunov, included in the Slavic Season, are directed by János Szikora and András Almási-Tóth, respectively. The audience attending Artaban can take part in a unique theatrical experience based on the concept of Szilveszter Ókovács and Tamás Érdi, Csaba Káel will reimagine his Il barbiere di Siviglia at the Margaret Island Open-Air Theatre, and the Salzburg Don Giovanni by renowned director Claus Guth also enters the Hungarian State Opera repertoire.

Popular productions by CALIXTO BIEITO, FABIO CERESA, KIRSTEN DEHLHOLM, GEORGES DELNON, VADIM MILKOV, MICHAŁ ZNANIECKI, FERENC ANGER, TIBOR BOGÁNYI, GÉZA M. TÓTH, JÁNOS MOHÁCSI, MÁTÉ SZABÓ, MIKLÓS SZINETÁR, and performances mixing opera and dance by DÓRA BARTA will also return to the repertoire.

Following this season's *The Wooden Prince* performance, two further dance pieces, *Dance Suite* and *The Miraculous Mandarin* by Bartók will be staged with new choreographies by Kristóf Várnagy and Marianna Venekei. After a hiatus due to the restoration of the Opera House, productions by Anna-Marie Holmes and László Seregi will return to the stage of the historic venue. The repertoire will once again include classical and neoclassical productions by John Cranko, Wayne Eagling, Sir Kenneth MacMillan, Michael Messerer and Tamás Solymosi as well as contemporary pieces by Boris Eifman, William Forstyhe, Jiří Kylián, Hans van Manen and many other international choreographers.
